NCJLS General Rules Request for Consideration

Rule 10. Number of Entries: Each Exhibitor will be allowed to exhibit **two (2)** market entries in the show **but no more than one entry per species**. The first entry presented for sifting in the **respective species** is the entry.

Rule 10. a. Last Sentence change to **“Each Exhibitor is allowed two market projects (no more than one entry per species)”**

We are one of the only, if not, the only county show in the State of Texas which doesn't allow exhibitors to exhibit more than one market species. My hope it that kids who have the desire to venture into other Market projects would be given the opportunity to expand their knowledge of more “phases of Agriculture” as is part of our Mission Statement. This change would help a few market divisions that would benefit by potential increase in participation. The other concern in years past with this type of rule change, was having the room for the potential extras projects. Since our decline in market projects over the past 3-4 years that is not a problem. If this becomes a problem this rule could be revisited.

Addition to rules if passed: **Only one Market project will be allowed to sell in the Auction.**

I believe that is a good rule in our case. Thus not increasing the number of lots in the sale. This change would help a few market divisions that would benefit by potential increase in participation. The other concern in years past, was having the room for the potential extras projects. Since our decline in project over the past 3-4 years that is not a problem. If this becomes a problem this rule could be revisited if passed. If an exhibitor earns Grand/Reserve in multiple species, I would follow the rule above noting only one Market project allowed in the sale. I think we should recognize that exhibitor for their accomplishment of Grand or Reserve in the market project, but not allow it to sell as a second project.

Addition to rules if passed: **If exhibiting a project in multiple species, the exhibitor must decide which project would be in the sale within 1 hour after the conclusion of the last market animal exhibited by that exhibitor.**

Alternative to the above rule, for the board to consider: **To allow an exhibitor to show two market entries in the show (can be two in the same species or one in two different species).**

General Rules: Auction Rules

I move we amend the necessary NCJLS Auction Rules to allow for a 100% premium only sale for all market animals, similar to the changes enacted for the 2021 (Covid) sale, but not exactly the same.

Reasoning:

- Buyers are having to calculate resale values on the fly during the sale. Premium only would allow them to know exactly how much they are spending when the gavel drops.
- Exhibitors currently selling premium only get to retain their animals, and value, whereas those choosing to sell the animal outright lose the monetary benefit of the resale value. During the sale, it is unlikely that

buyers take this fact into consideration when bidding on projects. In short, exhibitors selling premium only have a monetary advantage, especially with steers. Here are some stats from the 2022 sale:

- Total resale value of projects “not” sold premium only:
\$34,143.34

- Avg resale value by species forfeited:
 - Goats: \$247.76
 - Steers: \$1,538.33
 - Lambs: \$262.50
 - Swine: \$81.79

- Avg monetary loss per non-premium only projects: \$177.83
- Projects affected: 192 (35% of the sale)

Buyer Retention of Animals for Personal Use

Currently, buyers of non-premium only animals can opt to pick the animal up themselves. A premium only sale would not give them physical ownership of the animal. If we still wanted to allow them to pick up these animals for their own use they would have to know that they still owe for the resale value of that project. This could be a little confusing. Possible solutions:

- Not allow buyers to pick up any non-premium only animals.
- They could fill out the sales slip in the same way, with the explicit understanding that they will be billed for the resale value in addition to the premium auction price. The resale value might need to be listed on the auction list (like it is now), which could be confusing.
- If we feel that buyers really want this option, but are not really married to which specific animal they are getting, we could establish a set price for each project project (steer, lamb, goat, and swine) and cull them back/identify them during the sale so they don't get loaded on the truck.

Validation.....September 6, 2022

1. **Purpose:** The purpose of the Commercial Heifer Show and Sale is to provide a project that will expose the exhibitors to commercial cattle production. This included the purchasing, development, exhibition, and marketing of commercial heifers. This project is not part of the NCJLS Premium Action. Therefore, 4-H and FFA members can sell in this program as well as the NCJLS Premium Auction. However, exhibitors must abide by the General NCJLS Rules..
2. This show is limited to projects owned, fed and under the daily care of Nueces County 4-H and FFA members in good standing and under the supervision of the Agriculture Science Teachers and County Extension Agents. The Junior Commercial Heifer Show and Sale is an opportunity to show and sell commercial heifers. Any heifer exhibited in the Commercial Heifer Show will not be allowed to compete in any other Junior Beef Heifer Show of Nueces County Junior Livestock Show (NCJLS).
3. An unlimited number of heifers may be tagged at validation. Exhibitor must own heifers 100% throughout feeding period starting at validation through time of show. Only two head will be allowed to compete in the show and sale. If a heifer is unable to compete and the exhibitor has only one (1) remaining heifer, that single heifer will be able to sell in the sale but will be ineligible to compete for awards or prize money.
4. **Validation:** To be eligible to show **ALL** junior commercial heifer entries will be tagged at **RMBRF** on **September 6, 2022 (5:00p.m.-7:00p.m.)**. Each exhibitor is limited to show one pen of heifers.–Each exhibitor may validate unlimited number of heifers. Family validation is permitted. **Exhibitor must feed and care for his/her pen in Nueces County. Any exhibitor caring for or taking their pen of heifers out of the county must receive permission from the NCJLS Board per the NCJLS General Rules.** Any exhibitor found to be feeding animals out of the county without proper consent from the NCJLS Board will be disqualified without refund of entry or nomination money. **A nomination fee of \$20 per pen**

will be required by **August 2, 2022**. Late nominations will be accepted but will be assessed a late fee of \$40. Additionally, an entry fee of \$20 per pen is due on **August 2, 2022**. Cattle will be classified at validation. Classification determination is at the judge's discretion and is final.

Three divisions will be classified at validation:

- **British/Exotic-no Brahman influence**
- **American-less than 50% Brahman influence**
- **Brahman Influenced-50% Brahman influence or more**

5. An average weight of no less than 550 and no more than 800 pounds per head will be allowed at validation. **Heifers will be weighed by pen or individually, but the average will be on all heifers in the pen.**

6. Animals may be grazed or fed and will be judged as replacement heifers.

7. **Weigh-In & Check In:** Final weigh in and check in will take place together on **Wednesday, January 11, 2023, between the hours of 5:00p.m. -7:00 p.m.at RMBRF**. Heifers will be palpated at that time at exhibitors' expense (~~deducted from the sale price of each heifer~~) (payable to show vet directly-please have exact amount). All heifers are to be guaranteed open by a licensed veterinarian. Any bred heifer will be disqualified. Heifers must average a 1# per day weight gain from validation date to check in date or it will be sifted. Sifting for the show will be enforced at the time. Exhibitors are eligible for one re-weigh immediately following their first weigh in.

8. ~~Check-In, Interview & Record Book: Commercial Heifers will be delivered to RMBRF on Thursday, January 6, 2022 between the hours of 5:00p.m. -7:00p.m.~~ **Exhibitors will be required to participate in an interview on Thursday, January 12, 2023 starting at 8:00a.m.** Judges will conduct interviews at the exhibitor's pen. Cattle and Interviews will have time slots for judging. Interview will be based on the exhibitor's knowledge of all areas of his/her exhibit. Interview will be scored out of **75 points**. Official Record Book must be used (with no alterations). Information should be correct and legible, with documentation including all expenditures. Record Book will be scored out of a possible **15 points**. Each exhibitor will turn in 3 copies of their record book (1 original & 2 copies). ~~Awards will be given for the best combined Interview/Record Book (Salesmanship) scores in Junior, Intermediate, and Senior divisions (Buckle). 1. Purpose: The purpose of the Bred Heifer Show and Sale is to provide a project that will expose the exhibitors to bred cattle production. This included the purchasing, development, exhibition, and marketing of commercial heifers. This project is not part of the NCJLS Premium Action. Therefore, 4-H and FFA members can sell in this program as well as the NCJLS Premium Auction. However, exhibitors must abide by the General NCJLS Rules..

2. This show is limited to projects owned, fed and under the daily care of Nueces County 4-H and FFA members in good standing and under the supervision of the Agriculture Science Teachers and County Extension Agents. The Junior Commercial Heifer Show and Sale is an opportunity to show and sell commercial heifers. Any heifer exhibited in the Bred Heifer Show will not be allowed to compete in any other Junior Beef Heifer Show of Nueces County Junior Livestock Show (NCJLS).

3. Validation: To be eligible to show **ALL** junior bred heifer entries will be tagged at **RMBRF** on **June 14, 2022 (5:00p.m. -7:00p.m.)**. Each exhibitor is limited to show one pen of heifers (2 heifers).-Each exhibitor may validate no more than 5 head. Family validation is permitted. Heifers **must be open** at validation and a minimum of 14 months of age. **Exhibitor must feed and care for his/her pen in Nueces County. 1. **Validation:** All market swine to be entered and eligible to show must have been the property of the exhibitor, on feed and under his daily care by November 13, 2021. **12,2022 Validation will take place at designated locations on three (3) days** to be determined by the Swine Validation Committee and published in this catalog. Dates and locations must be submitted to the Show Office by May 15th.
 - a. To be eligible to exhibit in the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show, all market swine must be validated in the Nueces County Swine Validation Program. Market swine must be in the possession and under the daily feed and care of the exhibitor no later than the validation date. *Validation will take place at the following dates and locations :*
 - **November 8th 7th - 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM**

Calallen Ag Building
 - **November 11th 10th - 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM**
Tuloso Midway Ag Building
 - **November 13th 12th --(RMBRF) 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM only.**
 - b. All validation forms must be completed, accurate and in the hands of the county validation chair within 7 business days of the final county validation or pigs will be automatically disqualified.

Swine will be validated according to the latest guidelines set forth by the State Validation committee.

Each entry must be recorded on the Swine Validation Form Master list completed by the County Swine Validation Committee. The committee will be composed of 1 Ag Science Teacher from each chapter in the county, 1 County Extension Agent and 1 representative from each school district. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the Nueces County Swine Validation Program in any manner will result in immediate disqualification.

2. **Barrows/Gilts:** Barrows and gilts may be shown in the Market Swine Division.
3. **Check-In:** Market swine must be on the show grounds starting at 1:00pm, and no later than 6:00pm, Tuesday, January 11 **17th**, 2022. **Market Swine exhibitors MUST have eligibility voucher in hand in order to unload pigs. Voucher's for EVERY pig in trailer must be present at time of unloading. If vouchers cannot be presented for EVERY pig, the trailer will be sent to the end of the line. There will be NO partial unloading of trailers.** Animals will not be allowed into the barn during Tuesday check-in that are sick or show signs of external parasites. If swine shows signs of stress a veterinarian along with swine superintendents will make the decision if the swine is allowed into the show. All swine must be disqualified and removed from the show grounds by the exhibitor within one hour if the animal cannot move under their own power.

Pen assignment requests are due from Ag teachers and 4-H club managers by December 10 **9th**, 2021. 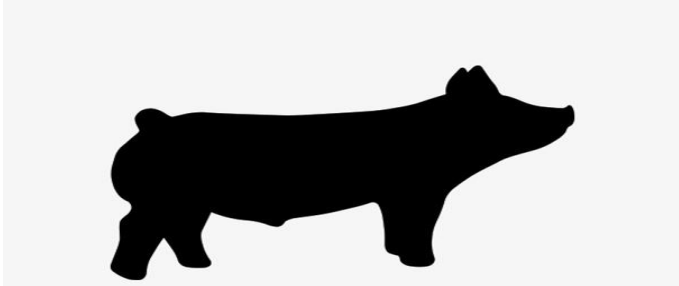

PURPOSE: The purpose of this division is to educate, demonstrate, and encourage 4-H, FFA, and FCCLA members the importance of rabbit production, selection, standards of perfection and promote the interest of the rabbit industry.

2023 NCJLS PROPOSED Rule Changes

RULES: RABBIT DIVISION

1. **CLASSES: NO CHANGE TO CLASSES**

2. **BREEDS:** All rabbits entered in the show must be purebred. A complete listing of breeds can be found in the ARBA Standard of Perfection. Class 1 Market Rabbits and Class 2 Single Fryers must be a recognized medium meat breed such as Californian and New Zealand. Class 3 Breeder Rabbits must be one of forty eight (48) breeds recognized by the ARBA.

3. **Validation:**

A: **December 10, 2022** from 8:00 AM to ~~11:30 AM~~ **10:00 AM**. **All rabbits must be in line by 10:00 AM** at the RMBRF (exact location to be determined.) **ALL RABBITS** must be the property of, on feed and under the daily care of the exhibitor at the time of validation. All rabbits eligible for class 1 Market Rabbits, Class 2 Single Fryers, and Class 3 Breeder Rabbits will be tattooed at this time by a committeeman for permanent identification. Breeder Rabbits already having a legible numerical and/or alphabetical tattoo will not need to be re-tattooed, but must still be brought to validation so that their numerical and/or alphabetical numbers can be recorded. **We encourage breeder rabbits be tattooed prior to validation.**

B: All rabbits must be presented for validation in wire bottom cage or carrier with a suspended floor. No boxes, crates, pet taxis or any solid floors will be allowed. Rabbits must be clean and healthy and show no sign of diarrhea. Rabbits that are deemed unclean either by urine, feces, or illness will not be validated or checked in.

C: Rabbits weighing over 3 pounds at time of validation will not be validated.

D. Per General/Show rule #6 on animal residency, a physical housing address must be provided at time of entry. All rabbits, including market, fryer, and breed rabbits, must be housed at this address. **Random spot checks may be completed by committee members.**

4: Check-In/Weigh and Sift: Market Rabbits and Single Fryers will be weighed and sifted on Wednesday, **January 18, 2023** from 12:00 PM TO 5:00 PM at the RMBRF. Breeder Rabbits will be weighed and sifted on Wednesday, **January 18, 2023** from 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM at the RMBRF. Exhibitors will present market/fryer rabbits to sifting judge. The committee will not pick pens or fryers during the sifting process. All rabbits must be presented for validation in wire bottom cage or carrier with a suspended floor. No boxes, crates, pet taxis or any solid floors will be allowed. Rabbits must be clean and healthy and show no sign of diarrhea. Rabbits that are deemed unclean either by urine, feces, or illness will not be validated or checked in. All rabbits will be weighed and sifted in the presence of a qualified judge and must meet weight standards for class and breed according to ARBA Standard of Perfection. **Market Rabbits and Single Fryers not weighing between three and one-half pounds to five and one-half pounds** or displaying any signs of disease, external parasites or physical abnormalities will be sifted. **If any rabbit in the pen is sifted, a qualified alternate must immediately be substituted in the presence of the sifting judge or the entire pen will be sifted.** All rabbits besides the market and fryers must be removed from the barn immediately following check-in. There will be no refund of entry fees for sifted animals.

A. **No storing of any accessories items on top of cages.**

5: Showmanship: Showmanship will begin at approximately 6:00 PM following check-in on Wednesday, **January 18, 2023** in the show arena. Showmanship will consist of a hands-on demonstration of rabbit knowledge to a qualified showmanship judge. Participants will need to demonstrate their ability to handle and care for their rabbits as well as general knowledge of rabbits in a verbal interview with the judge. Contestants will compete in age groups of Junior, Intermediate, and Senior (refer to NCJLS rules #19). The judge will select a winner from each age division and then select

an overall top showman from the top of each age division. Rabbits used for showmanship must be participating in the show. (Breeders, market or fryer) It cannot be an extra rabbit.

6: Judge: Market Rabbit judging will begin at 8:00 AM, Thursday, **January 19, 2023** in the show arena. Single Fryer judging will begin immediately following Market Rabbit judging conclusion. Breeder Rabbit judging will begin immediately following Breeder check-in on Wednesday, **January 18, 2023** in the show arena. All exhibitors must be present with their rabbits at time of judging or the exhibitor's project will be subject to elimination. Should an exhibitor have conflict and cannot be with his/her project at time of judging, he/she must contact the Superintendent immediately for consideration. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their animals and carriers are encouraged in the arena with water only, no feed, no chairs or stools will be allowed in arena due to limited room.

7. ARBA Standards: The rules of the American Rabbit Breeder Association (ARBA) Standard of Perfections latest edition will be used by the sifting judge and show judge. All ARBA disqualifications, eliminations and general faults will apply to each entry. Only qualified ARBA judges will be selected and their decisions shall be considered final. A judge shall not be required to place more than twenty five (25) entries in classes of fifty (50) or more No committee member, board member or show associate will instruct the judge on the number of blue ribbons awarded. Instruction will however be given to the sifting and show judge that only high quality animals be accepted.

8. Release: All rabbits and attached items are to be removed from the show cages by 9:00 AM Sunday morning following the sale. Any rabbits or related items left after this time will be removed and disposed of by a rabbit committee member. Any exceptions to this rule must be approved by the Rabbit Committee Superintendent.

9. Sale: Grand and Reserve Champion Market Rabbits are required to participate in the Parade of Champions on Saturday. Grand and Reserve Champion Single Fryers and Grand and Reserve Champion Breeders may participate in the Parade of Champions on Saturday provided they are in line at designated time. Blue ribbon Market Rabbits will sell in the Blue Ribbon Sale (refer to General Rule #30) in alphabetical order according to club; this order will rotate from year to year. Exhibitors are expected to be with their rabbits 30 minutes prior to the market rabbit sale and are required to be with their rabbits at the time of sale. **Premium sale only.** All locks must be removed from the pens on the day of the sale.

NCJLS Horse Show Committee,

Please consider a rule change request for the 2023 Show Class list to modify the Junior division to a Walk/ Trot, Walk/Jog (W/T W/J) division congruent with other horse shows in our surrounding area and beyond. (Examples attached)

Goals of the change:

- More closely mirror the classes offered State and Nationwide for junior most exhibitors
- Encourage increased participation in the Junior division
- Drive overall increase in Horse Division participation
- Build a base of new Junior competitors in 4-H clubs that could in turn, drive participation in other divisions and classes.

Often, and understandably, because there are few Junior competitors in the NCJLS horse show the classes are combined. This often results in a naturally wide disparity in skill set, horsemanship and control in a rail or pattern class amongst potentially a few novice 8-year-old – 10 year old's far outnumbered by a larger class of much older Senior competitors. While it has been unofficially communicated young horsemen can compete at a walk/ jog, this results in lower scoring

and a situation where our youngest riders are not only not competitive but discouraged. It is obvious by the low number of Junior competitors in the last several years that we should consider adapting our class listing to attract youth showing in other venues.

In line with other NCJLS competitions, if a Junior exhibitor elects to compete in a Senior Division the same rules could apply excluding competing in Junior classes and awards.

Communication and Promotion

- Socialization of the change with local boarding and lesson barns (Corpus Christi Horse House, Murphy’s Saddle Shop, Heather Ridge, Glen Oak Riding Stables, El Caballo Loco etc)
- Fliers with class list shared with local show circuits inside in outside of the county to capture in county exhibitors ahead of 4-H enrollment period

1. Photography Submission/Check-In is a two (2) step process:

- a. **Step 1:** All photos must be submitted online at ncjls.org (the same portal used for log-in at registration) by midnight on **December 31, 2021**.
- b. **Step 2:** All photos must be printed and the printed copy must be submitted at check-in on **January 10, 2023**. Photographs must be a minimum size of 8" x 10" and no larger than a maximum size of 11" x 14". Photographs must be mounted on foam board or mat board with no visible border. Exhibitor may indicate the orientation of the photo by drawing an arrow on the back of the photo mat board.
